Did you know that reading aloud regularly to your child stimulates optimal patterns of brain development? Did you know that it can strengthen your parent-child relationship? The answer to both of these questions is yes, it can and will. Reading aloud should begin at birth and continue until your child enters Kindergarten gaining the ability to read on their own. Even after your child learns to read by themselves it's still important for you to read aloud together. By reading stories that are on their interest level and slightly above their level stretches the young readers skills of understanding and motivates them to improve their skills. Reading to your child on a consistent basis will help build language, literacy and social-emotional skills.
